







A little bit of history

The first missionaries in Kitami were the American couple George and Ida Pierson, who lived and worked in Kitami from 1914 to 1928. Already during their time in Asahikawa (1901-1914), they were allowed to experience great revivals among the locals, especially in several large prisons that existed on Hokkaido at the time. In a report from 1908, they summarized their experiences as follows:

"Perhaps the strongest conviction of all is that of the terrible and universal need of the Power of the Holy Ghost, in ourselves first, and in our pastors, evangelists and Christians. [...] In the Hokkaido we have learned that an outpouring of the God's Holy Spirit is sent in answer to definite and persistent prayer, and that when the Holy Ghost comes a Revival follows. The Revival already come to the Hokkaido seems to be drawing nearer day by day."



This showed us that then, as now, the Holy Spirit is the only one who makes a difference in people's hearts and that we are in a long chain of kingdom workers, building on the prayers and spiritual advances of past generations.

There are now only three weeks left until our time in Kitami comes to an end. During this time we will have several farewell meetings and there will certainly be some tears. We are deeply grateful for the past two and a half years in Kitami, during which we were able to experience God's mighty work and learn so many spiritual truths.

Lately, we have been particularly happy about Mrs. Hoshi's husband, who is making great progress in trusting God. Both of them now have a daily morning devotion with Bible reading and prayer. Please continue to pray for him. We have the feeling that the breakthrough will come soon.

God Makes a Good Closure

Over the past two months, we have realized in several ways that the work God has called us to do in Kitami is fully his own, and that now he is gradually taking it out of our hands again to prepare us for the next assignment. For one, we experience this by God fulfilling, what he promised us about a year and a half ago. As we got more and more contacts then with "young" Japanese Christians scattered all over the country, we started to worry whether they were getting enough fellowship with other Christians. At that time, God made it clear to us that we should relax and let that be His concern, because he is the one who is building his church. We learned that we are not able and not meant to control everything, but that it is our part to be ready for action when he calls us. All the rest is done by the Holy Spirit, the Commander-in-Chief of God's mission. He sees the big picture.

God has now fulfilled his promise by once again bringing the Kawasakis from Lake Toya to Kitami in December and this time connecting them with several brothers and sisters from our church. They spent a lot of time together, told each other their conversion stories and exchanged phone numbers. In a similar way, Yasuko and her husband from Osaka, who we told you about in our last letter, visited us in January. On both occasions, the visitors were able to stay at Mrs. Hoshi's home. This was particularly important for her husband, as it allowed him to talk to Christian Japanese men who have come to faith in very different ways.
